At our January meeting the PI Team asked me to share with you a bit more of what the PI Team is doing. Currently, our focus is **Outreach** (or Evangelism, or Community Engagement). Homebound Communion is in place, happening, and running well.

Our "Little Book of Prayer" is an outreach tool and a prayer book created by "yours truly." Our talented Janet Broche designed the cover and made it happen. Copies were included in the goodie bag we provided to the homeowners we served at our January  $C\bar{O}D\bar{O}$  event. We'll have copies for all of you to kick off Lent, Ash Wednesday, March 5. I hope that you find it a useful little item to tuck in your purse or pocket or to keep on your bedside table.

We've created a  $\frac{1}{2}$  page card highlighting our upcoming events. These went into the  $C\overline{O}D\overline{O}$  goodie bag, too.

During our January meeting we brainstormed a bunch of ideas. Among our ideas, "Burma Shave" type signs to place along our property line and ways to engage more with our neighbors and communities. Watch this space for more information as our ideas take shape.

A PI Team wish list item will happen in the next few weeks. We are getting an attractive, glass, **write on calendar** to post in our entry. This will help us all to see what's up and coming at Resurrection.

The PI Team discussed ways that we can educate us and our community on the resources for help/assistance that are available in the Alton/Godfrey area. With the guidance and expertise of Sharon Groh, we're gathering brochures and items to make available to all of you and to anyone who visits our property. We're considering a brochure display marked "Help Center" to gather this information. We'd like it to be on wheels so we can move it into Young Hall when the hall is in use.

And, I have one more calendar item: a **Community Resource and Assistance Fair** on April 11, from 1:00-4:00 PM. Led by Sharon Groh. We are in the very early stages of planning this event, so I can't tell you much at this time. There will be much to share with you as our planning unfolds.

The PI Team Brochure Writing Sub Team has finished the update of our tri-fold brochure. It looks great! We (Vicki Baggio, Sharon Groh, Janet Broche and I) are preparing rack cards to supplement the brochure. These cards will provide more information about our church, our fellowship groups, ways we engage with our community, our worship and our core beliefs. These will probably be made available to folks in our help center.

The goal of these efforts is to continually explore ways that we can reach out to and engage the community. It is my frequently stated goal, that anyone who comes to our church and our property have a good experience. Having a good experience at Resurrection creates engagement, heightens the awareness of others about our church and what we do, and encourages them to visit again and to perhaps join us in worship or reach out to us in a crisis or time of need.

But Nina is out there looking for her husband, and she won't stop until the truth is discovered.

On March 13th, Carol Garner will be our discussion leader and her book choice is <u>The Women</u> by Kristin Hannah. Available at our local library.

**Summary:** "Women can be heroes, too." When twenty-year-old nursing student Frances "Frankie" McGrath hears these unexpected words, it is a revelation. Raised on idyllic Coronado Island and sheltered by her conservative parents, she has always prided herself on doing the right thing, being a good girl. But in 1965 the world is changing, and she suddenly imagines a different choice for her life. When her brother ships out to serve in Vietnam, she impulsively joins the Army Nurse Corps and follows his path. As green and inexperienced as the men sent to Vietnam to fight, Frankie is overwhelmed by the chaos and destruction of war, as well as the unexpected trauma of coming home to a changed and politically divided America. The Women is the story of one woman gone to war, but it shines a light on the story of all women who put themselves in harm's way to help others. Women whose sacrifice and commitment to their country has all too often been forgotten. A novel of searing insight and lyric beau-

ty, The Women is a profoundly emotional, richly drawn story with a memorable heroine whose extraordinary idealism and courage under fire define a generation.

# Highlight's from Church Council – January

#### REPORTS

- \* Treasurer's Report: Total offering for December was \$17,466.42. A parishioner that pays quarterly accounts for most of the increase. Total income for December was \$17,568.66. Total expenses were \$14,227.39 for the month. The power bill jumped to \$967.15. Our net income for December was \$3,219.03.
- \* President's Report: Neal followed up on a few items from last month, including purchasing a memorial, purchasing a decorative glass calendar for the narthex and regrouping Council with new dates/times to meet with the congregation, as weather and communications with the Bishop's office delayed the process.

#### \* Pastor's Report:

- The first Afternoon at the Movies was held on 1/21. Only one member attended.
- The PI Team continues with Outreach efforts. The Brochure team will meet to begin work on the sub brochures highlighting the various activities and groups at Resurrection.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday Lunch Bunch will meet on Feb. 9<sup>th</sup> at Bluff City Grill after being canceled in January.
- Russ is prerecording our services during the week and the s seems to be a good fix for the time being. He has agreed to play for Ash Wednesday and Lenten Services as he will already be at church to record those Sunday's music.

\* No committees met and/or reported anything to Council for December.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

- \* Dan Garner presented several upcoming events that the Men's Club would like to host during the next several months. Council voted to accept the proposed activities and looks forward to all of our community outreach efforts... stay tuned !
- \* Council voted on paying Elyse Tillman for the Christmas Eve. As always, we are truly blessed to have her share her talents with us.
- \* Pastor will contact the local TV stations in regards to the process of reporting canceled services when inclement weather arises. Pastor and Neal will check with Janet Broche in regards to gaining access to Constant Contact, the platform used to send our mass emails. We would like to be able to send out notifications remotely when an urgent situation, funeral, prayers for someone hospitalized, etc. occurs.
  - It's not convenient to have that access only available at the Church office.

\* Council approved and voted on the purchase of 2 Lenten/Easter Worship banners.

\* Council discussed reclassifying the Community Garden to a Committee. Bob Doerr and Mark Groh would serve as the committee heads.

#### CONTINUING BUSINESS

- \* Discussion on the purchase of a memorial gift continued.
- \* Council approved the purchase of a large, decorative glass calendar for the Narthex in December. Brief discussion on its placement occurred. Kay will place the order.
- \* Pending Neal's availability, Council decided to host the small meetings with the congregation in regards to pastoral needs on Monday, February 3<sup>rd</sup>. The fourth session for anyone unable to attend will be held on Sunday, Feb. 16<sup>th</sup> following worship.
