

In 1969, Tommy James & The Shondells wrote and sang "Ball of Fire." This is a lesser-known hit from their compilation album, *The Best of Tommy James and The Shondells*. Occasionally you will hear this song played on Sirius 60s on 60, and quite possibly even own the album. After doing a little research, it appears that the message Tommy James intended was peace and good brotherhood. This would make logical sense given the political assassinations of 1968, the social unrest, the Vietnam War and the race riots to name a few. Others believed LSD tablets were being referenced, also a trippy sign of the times.

The title "Ball of Fire" is reportedly inspired by the Book of Revelation, where Tommy James found references to a time of harmony and peace. Additionally, some sources suggest inspiration came from the Book of Ezekiel, with its mention of a blue light representing God's presence, leading to another great Tommy James song, "Crystal Blue Persuasion," with lyrics about a new day coming and people changing.

Obviously "Ball of Fire" had some degree of spiritual context vs. James' hit "Hanky Panky" in 1966, which we all know had quite the different vibe. As we embrace Summer 2025, already shinning on us in full force, I think we as Christians can relate a much greater meaning to these words.

CPR & AED Training


YOU COULD SAVE A LIFE!

However, we want everyone to be prepared for a potential emergency. Knowledge of CPR is something that can be used anywhere, by anyone, at any time. The Central/Southern Illinois Synod met on June 5-7 at St. John's Lutheran Church in Bloomington, where God dwelled with us as we conducted business, listened to what God is doing across the synod, and joined together in fellowship. The title above is the Synod's theme.

I'm just going to hit a few highlights -


- *Keynote Speaker: Rev. Dr. Dwight Zscheile of Luther Seminary. He provided three excellent presentations on adapting the church to serve in the 21st century. He has written several books. - *Pedal for a Purpose: Led by the Rev. Adam Dichsen, Pedal for a Purpose raised more than \$5,000 for campus ministry. In addition to a very wet bike ride on June 4 and a short ride on June 5, an exercise bike was available for people to "ride" for donations. Pastor Amy Ziettlow, assistant to the Bishop, is shown in the photo below right.
- *Fellowship: As always, there was plenty of food and time for fellowship at the assembly. Friday started with a National Donut Day celebration, with donuts generously provided by one of our rostered leaders and his wife (John and Vicki Lottes), in celebration of their 55th wedding anniversary. Friday evening featured an "Oktoberfest celebration" of brats, pork chops, sauerkraut, potato salad, and more. The evening was accompanied by Al's Pals polka band.
- *Next year: The 2026 Synod Assembly will be an experimental one, with an online-only business session in June and "Synod days" of learning, worship, and fellowship in each conference in the fall. The assembly will be an in-person event in 2027.

<u>Highlight's from Church Council – May</u>

REPORTS

- * Treasurer's Report: Total offering for the month was \$9,209.48. Total income for the month was \$9,408.24. Total expenses were \$13,495.07. The cash flow balance for the month was \$-4,086.83. Extra expenses included a laptop for Kay and Neal for church-related purposes, Synod Assembly stipends and registration, and various donations that were made. Our CDs have made about \$1,300 in interest and we be renewing one for a 1yr term at 4.15%, which is pretty good given our current economy.
- * President's Report: Neal has successfully updated our Constant Contact, Google and Microsoft accounts, with current contacts, phone numbers, emails and back-up users. He will work with Pastor on cleaning up her office computer as well.

* Pastor's Report:

- Life Long Learners just finished a 2 week study on Mormonism and just began a 2 week study on Judaism on June 29th.
- Pastor is cleaning out her office and personalizing the space. It will be nice to see it become an inviting space vs. the storage room it has served over the past several years.
- Pastor will attend the Interim Ministry Worship in Springfield August 14th, that will focus on the "Discover and Invite" materials used for an creating up-to-date ministry site profile in the future. She will also attend The fall Theological Conference at Pere Marquette Sept. 22-24. She will travel for another Icon retreat in November.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

* Property— Dan Garner obtained an amazing bid to repair the ailing garage door. The lower panel will be replaced, along with the broken steel cable, new weatherstripping and any necessary adjustments for \$696. A motion was made and passed to fix this issue. Bob Doerr will get back with Richard Mosby, a carpenter for bids on hand-made front doors. The efforts to redirect the gutters behind the alter appear to be working as no water has re-entered the sanctuary. Plans to bury those new lines will be made for the fall after a few more months of testing and hopefully some heavy rains.
